Gather at Toronto Pearson Airport to embark on your flight to Dublin.

Saturday, 11 August 2012 - Welcome to Ireland

On arrival at Dublin Airport, meet with your coach driver and transfer to your hotel.

Early afternoon, meet with your Tour Guide to enjoy a Dublin City Tour. Founded in 841 by the Vikings, it is a city with an interesting past. A visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral will take you back to medieval times, while a walk around Merrion Square will remind you of the glorious days of Dublin when it was ranked as the second city of the British Empire after London. Visit Trinity College, the oldest University in Ireland, founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth 1st and see the Book of Kells – a 9th century gospel manuscript famous throughout the world.

This evening, join your group for a welcome dinner at the hotel.

Overnight: Jury's Inn Parnell Street, Dublin (D.)

Sunday, 12 August 2012 – Dublins Fair City

Spend the day at leisure in Dublin for some personal sightseeing or shopping. We recommend a stroll down Grafton Street. Use your Hop On Hop Off Dublin Bus Pass, valid for 24 hours

Tonight, enjoy dinner and traditional Irish entertainment at the Abbey Tavern, an authentic 16th Century tavern with original stonewalls, gaslights and blazing turf fires. Before the entertainment, a typical 3-course Irish dinner is served, finishing with a Baileys Irish Cream Coffee.

Overnight: Jury's Inn Parnell Street, Dublin (B.D.)

Monday, 13 August 2012 – Dublin to Donegal

Today depart for Co. Donegal. En route visit Brú Na Bóinne Visitors Centre & Newgrange. The Megalithic Passage Tomb at Newgrange was built about 3200 BC. Continue to hotel in Donegal

Overnight: Caisleain Oir Hotel, Donegal (B.D.)

Tuesday, 14 August 2012 – Kincasslagh Daniel Sites

Today enjoy a full day touring of Kincasslagh Daniel sites. See where Daniel was born and raised, visit the church where he was married and much more. This evening stroll around the village before joining your group for dinner.

Overnight: Caisleain Oir Hotel, Donegal (B.L.D.)

Wednesday, 15 August 2012 – Donegal to Galway

Today depart Donegal and travel to Westport via Sligo

County Sligo's beautiful scenery was an inspiration for Yeats, who is buried at Drumcliff Churchyard, under loaf-shaped Benbulbin Mountain. At Carrowmore, you'll find the largest megalithic cemetery in Ireland. Visit Drumcliffe & W.B Yeats Grave. His tomb can be found in the cemetery of a small, simple church in Drumcliff. The church, in which his grandfather had been rector, was built on the foundations of St. Columba's 6th century monastery. The tombstone of Ireland's greatest poet is simple and carries the famous epitaph written by the author himself. "Cast a cold eye on life, on death, horseman pass by"

Overnight: Forster Court Hotel, Galway (B.L.)

Thursday, 16 August 2012 – Connemara Tour

Today enjoy a full day Connemara tour, a land of lakes and rivers, bogs and mountains. A land of small villages where Gaelic is still the spoken language and where little has changed since the beginning of time. It is without a doubt the wildest and the most romantic part of Ireland.

Enjoy a cruise on Killary Harbour, recognized as Ireland's only Fjord, this nine mile long inlet boasts some of the finest scenery in the West of Ireland and because of its sheltered nature its waters are always calm.

Return to your hotel in Galway.

Overnight: Forester Court Hotel, Galway (B.D.)

Friday, 17 August 2012 – Burren and Cliffs of Moher

Depart Galway and travel to Killarney via the Burren, part of which forms the 100 square km Burren National Park. The Burren contains dozens of megalithic tombs and Celtic crosses as well as a ruined Cistercian Abbey dating back to the 12th century. The flora on the Burren is a mixture Arctic and Mediterranean and rare flowers such as gentian, orchids and bloody cranesbill are the rule rather than the exception.

Visit the Cliffs of Moher, situated on the Atlantic Ocean, one of Ireland's most spectacular sights. Standing 230 metres above the ground at their highest point and 8km long, the Cliffs boast one of the most amazing views in Ireland. Take the Cross-Shannon car ferry and continue to hotel in Kerry.

Tonight enjoy your first Daniel concert.

Overnight: Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney (B.D.C.)

Saturday, 18 August 2012 – Ring of Kerry

The Ring of Kerry is the most famous and panoramic route in Ireland. En route around the Ring, take in spectacular scenery - mountains, peat bogs, lakes and magnificent views of the Atlantic Ocean as one travels along the coast road. Leaving Killarney pass through Killorglin, famous for its Puck Fair, then to Glenbeigh where the cliff road affords panoramic views of the Dingle Peninsula and Dingle Bay. Continuing to Cahirciveen, you'll pass the birthplace of National hero, Daniel O'Connell. Next, continue on through peat bogs to the town of Waterville. Continue to Sneem Village, famous for its brightly coloured houses. The road then continues through the mountains to Molls Gap and Ladies View with superb views of the famous Lakes of Killarney.

Visit Muckross House & Gardens. Muckross is a magnificent Victorian mansion built in 1843 and is one of Ireland's leading stately homes. Built on the shores of Muckross Lake, it is beautifully situated amidst the spectacular scenery of Killarney National Park. The Gardens of Muckross House are famed for their beauty worldwide.

Overnight: Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney. (B.)

Sunday, 19 August 2012 – Dingle Peninsula

Depart on a half day excursion to the Dingle Peninsula, the most northern of the Kerry Peninsulas. This peninsula is famous for its Celtic, pre-Christian monuments and Christian churches. It is also a 'Gaeltacht' (Irish speaking) area, where the Irish language and traditional ways of life are preserved. From Inch, a long beach bordered by dunes and made famous by David Lean's movie "Ryan's Daughter," admire the Iveragh Peninsula and Rossbeigh Beach. From Dingle, drive around the coast to Sleah Head. Here the blue of the marine landscape surrounds the Blaskets Islands, deserted since 1953.

Tonight enjoy an evening concert.

Overnight: Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney (B.D.C.)

Monday, 20 August 2012 – Killarney to Bunratty

Today depart Killarney and travel to Bunratty via the town of Adare, regarded as one of Ireland's most picturesque villages with thatched cottages dotted throughout the town. These were created by the 3rd Earl of Dunraven in the 1820's for his estate workers.

Visit Bunratty Castle & Folk Park. Bunratty Castle is one of the most complete and authentic medieval castles in Ireland. The castle hosts medieval banquets and takes the participants back to the time that the castle entertained its visitors with fine food, wine and song. Within the grounds of Bunratty Castle is Bunratty Folk Park. The Folk Park demonstrates everyday life in rural Ireland of the 19th century.

Tonight enjoy dinner and entertainment at Bunratty Castle Medieval Banquet, a true step back in time to Medieval Ireland.

Overnight: Bunratty Castle Hotel, Bunratty (B.D.)

Tuesday, 21 August 2012 – Farewell to Ireland

After a final Irish breakfast, transfer to Shannon Airport for departure flight home (B.)

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
